24th August to 13th September – 21 days/20 nights extravaganza



A South India 'Sojourn' or 'short stay in a place that is different from your usual milieu' begins in exotic Mumbai......originally the epicentre of British Colonial rule, Mumbai intrigues with Architecture such as the Grand Railway station, Gateway to India, the Dhobi Ghats where HUGE quantities of Mumbai's daily washing is done and displayed and more. Onto Bangalore, or Bengaluru as it is now called, the Capital of Karnataka State and is rich with its 19th century Bangalore Palace and Tipu Sultan's Summer Palace, an 18th century teak structure. Mysore, the 'City of Palaces' is next on our itinerary, a city of beautiful proportion and visual delight. The Mysore Palace blends Hindu, Islamic, Gothic and Rajput styles. Mysore is also home to the centuries old Devaraja markets filled with spices, silks and sandalwood. Then Hampi, a relatively newly created World Heritage Site, Hampi is an ancient town in the rural south, dotted with ancient temple complexes from the early 14th Century Vijayanagara Empire.

With so much history and cultural components, it's time to relax in Goa, the 'must see' tropical paradise visited by tourists from all over the world since the 1970's. Goa has maintained its natural tropical/seaside beauty since then, alongside its' Portuguese history encompassing religious elements and architecture. Enjoy Palolem where we will stay, noted as 'Best Beach in Goa' by Trip Advisor.

And there is still more...Pune, Aurangabad, Nashik (now it's time for the famous 'SULA' Winery for lunch, tastings and an afternoon of relaxation). A great day and night in Nashik, and the next day a leisurely drive to Mumbai International Airport for your evening flight back to Australia.

Program

Mumbai

3 nights 24, 25 & 26 Aug

On arrival in Mumbai you will be met with a garland welcome and transferred to our hotel. After a good night's sleep, we will begin exploring Mumbai over the next two days. Visiting the Gateway of India, indulge in a water excursion to the infamous **Elephant Caves**, and later in the day visiting the **Dhobi Ghats**. The Dhobi Ghats are an amazing experience where there are rows upon rows of open-air concrete wash pens, each fitted with its own flogging stone. This is considered the world's largest outdoor laundry. And we will see much more including Victoria Terminus and the slum areas where 'Slumdog Millionaire' was filmed.

Mumbai -**Bangalore**

2 nights 27 & 28 Aug

Fly to Bangalore mid afternoon, the Capital of Karnataka State, founded by Kempe Gowda 1, who built a mud fort at the site in 1537. The earliest evidence of a 'place called Bangalore' is C890! Cubbon Park is a distinctively English style park with form and structure as its' centerpieces. Next to Cubbon Park is Vidhana Soudha, a Neo-Dravidian building. Former royal residences include Bangalore Palace, modelled after Windsor Castle, plus Tipu Sultan's Summer **Palace**, an 18th century teak structure.

Bangalore -Mysore

3 nights 29, 30 & 31 Aug

A leisurely drive to Mysore. We will visit the infamous Mysore Palace, an historical palace and a royal residence. Mysore is commonly described as the 'City of Palaces', and there are seven palaces. The land on which the palace now stands was originally known as Puragiri (literally, citadel). The current Palace was constructed between 1897 and 1912, after the Old Palace was burnt to the ground. The Palace is now one of the most famous tourist attractions in India, after the Taj Mahal, with more than 6 million visitors annually. We will also visit the Jaganmohan Palace and Art Gallery, and Chamudeswari Temple. We will spend a good amount of time at local markets, these are extensive, organized and SO colourful, definitely not to be missed!

Mysore-Hampi

3 nights 1, 2 & 3 Sept

We will leave our Mysore hotel early for our daytime drive to Hampi. Staying at the beautiful 'Hampi Heritage Resort' our activities will start the following day after lunging by the pool and in our villas. The next two days (tours are half days on each day) will be spent discovering the UNESCO sites of Hampi including Sri Virupaksh Temple, Vitthal Temple, the Royal Enclosure (all buildings), the Lakshmi Narsimha statue and Shiva Temple. Hampi is extensive so some leisure time as a balance is necessary for relaxation, to recuperate and invigorate.

Hampi - Goa

4 nights 4, 5, 6 & 7 Sept After breakfast we will take our A/C mini bus from Hampi to Goa arriving in beautiful Palolem **Beach**, Goa in the latter part of the day, a journey of incomparable beauty. The following morning of our time at Palolem Beach, we will have the chance to walk the beaches located next to our hotel, to bathe in the pool, to enjoy a traditional Goan boat ride to Butterfly Beach, Honeymoon Beach, and Agonda Beach to do some dolphin watching. Next day, we will be travelling to various parts of 'Old Goa' with a guide, to embrace the older Portuguese Architecture of this strong European community and some of the Churches ornately and interestingly decorated. The balance of time is for you. You may decide to hire a motorbike, to get a tuk tuk to additional places, to canoe through the surf or simply to swim and relax by the Indian Ocean.

Goa - Pune

2 nights 8 & 9 Sept Early afternoon we will fly from Goa arriving in beautiful Pune mid afternoon. Pune was once the base of the 'Peshwas' (Prime Ministers) of the Maratha Empire, which lasted 1674 – 1818. Pune is particularly known for the Aga Khan Palace built in 1892 and now a memorial to Mahatma Ghandi, whose ASHES ARE PRESERVED IN THE GARDEN. The 8th century Pataleshwar Cave Temple is dedicated to the Hindu God Shiva. Pune is home to numerous forts and wadas highlighting the Maratha architecture. Maratha Fort of Shaniwar Wada is one of the main attractions in Pune. Many temples and ashrams are also spread across the city.

Pune – Aurangabad

2 nights 10 & 11 Sept

After breakfast we will take our A/C mini bus from Pune arriving in Aurangabad in the afternoon. The evening will be at your leisure. The next morning, we will head to the very famous Ajana and Ellora Caves. Enjoy the day with our professional guide exploring the caves and surrounds. The caves are a UNESCO World Heritage Site and are one of the largest rock-cut monasteries temple complexes featuring Buddhist, Hindu and Jain monuments and artwork. There are approximately 30 rock-cut Buddhist cave monuments forming the Ajana Caves which date from the 2nd century. The caves include paintings and rock-cut sculptures described as among the finest surviving examples of ancient Indian art.
