

# HOLI FESTIVAL 2024

21st March to 3rd April 2024



Holi Festival is the Festival of colours, happiness, and a whole lot more. The Festival signifies the victory of good over evil, the ability for Hindus, to laugh, forget and forgive. The explosion of colours at Holi is a strong influence from the story of Sri Krishna and Radha. Radha had always had a fair complexion of which Krishna was jealous, so his Mother said he could colour Radha's face and colours he wished, and he did. The Festival mends broken relationships and brings people together in peace and unity.

After Holi we will embrace the radical Architecture of Le Corbusier in Chandigarh which will delight. You will experience unusual and imposing buildings, later you will embrace the Golden Temple in Amritsar, Qutub Minar in Delhi built almost 1000 years ago, the more recent Architectural extravagance of Akshardham Temple, the quintessential Taj Mahal in Agra, the gorgeous town of Shimla, the Summer retreat for the English during their occupation. Enjoy the weird Wagah Border ceremony on the border between Pakistan and India! Visit the home town of the Dalai Lama, and enjoy ALL this being guided through your experience with Kehren Eade and Rakesh Singh, hosts.

#### <u>Program</u>

Delhi

3 nights 21, 22 & 23 March On arrival in Delhi you will be met with a Garland welcome and transferred to your glamorous 5-star hotel. Have a good night's sleep, you deserve it, and awaken refreshed and 'ready to go'.



Old Delhi and Jama Masjid - Relax and take it easy, as you might still be jet lagged. After a late breakfast, proceed to the old part of Delhi for a rickshaw ride through the back alleys of Old Delhi, the silver streets, vegetable and spice markets and visit the famous Jama Masjid, one of the oldest mosques in Delhi.

Lotus Temple – Design Iranian Architect Fariborz Sahba. Lotus Temple for all, regardless of religion. The building is composed of 27 free-standing marble-clad petals arranged in clusters. The Lotus Temple has won numerous architectural awards.

*Humayun's Tomb* – now a UNESCO World Heritage Site, built in the 16<sup>th</sup>-C by Haji Begum, wife of Humayun the second Mughal emperor, Humayun's Tomb is an example of Mughal Architecture in Delhi.

**Qutub Minar** - this 72.5 m high Victory Pillar is a victory stand of a Muslim King Kutub-ud-din- Aibak in India. In 1199 Kutub-ud-Din started its construction and it was completed in 1236 by Iltutmish, the son-in-law of Kutub.

India Gate – National monument of India. India gate is in the administrative locations of the country. Constructed in memory of 90,000 soldiers of British-Indian army who fought in the Second World War, the structure was built under the leadership of Sir Edwin Lutyens. The architectural complex is made of red stone and granite and is the finest example of Indo-British architectural monument.

And let's go along Rajpath, past the imposing India Gate, Parliament House, the President's Residence and would end with a drive through the Diplomatic Enclave.

*Mathura/ Bharatpur* 

2 nights 24 & 25 March (Holi Festival) 'Deluxe Room' at Metropolitan Hotel or similar

After a hearty breakfast you will be collected by the mini-bus to go to Bharatpur to your amazing Indian Palace hotel then on to Mathura, the spiritual home of the Holi Festival. Holi is the Festival of Colours, the Festival of Happiness, and so much more. For Hindus it is a Festival where they can rejoice in the victory of good over evil, it announces the arrival of Spring and the end of Winter, and a time to meet, greet, laugh, forget, forgive and enjoy family and friends. Holi gifts are given between people and the



application or throwing of paints on each other is a time honoured tradition as noted in our introduction. The colour red is used as the colour of love.

Embrace three days of festivities, it is a wonderful cultural festival full of fun and for people to get together. Near Bharatpur, you can also see the Lohagarh Fort (Iron Fort) - constructed by the Bharatpur Jat rulers of the time. Maharajah Suraj Mal used all his power and wealth for good causes and he built numerous palaces and Forts across his kingdom with Lohagarh Fort being one of the strongest built in Indian history. Monuments in the fort include Kishori Mahal, Mahal Khas, Kothi Khas, Moti Mahal and Fateh Buri. These were all erected to commemorate the victory of the Mughals over the British Army.



Taj Mahal - And for those keen to see the Taj Mahal, a short (ish) drive is available during these three days, if desired. Taj Mahal means 'Crown of the Palace' and is constructed of ivory white marble. It is a mausoleum commissioned in 1632 by the Mughal Emperor Shah Jahan for his beloved wife. The Taj Mahal was designated as a UNESCO World Heritage site in 1983, and is still regarded by many as the best piece of Mughal Architecture on the planet. With 20,000 artsians working on the project and taking nearly 20 years to complete, the Taj Mahal is truly a work of art.

Chandigarh

2 nights 26 & 27 March Morning after breakfast drive to Chandigarh - one of the best known, well planned cities in the world, was designed by the Swiss-French modernist architect, Le Corbusier. Chandigarh is famous for its amazing Post-Modernist Architecture and cityscape.



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Chandigarh, the capital of the northern Indian states of Punjab and Haryana, provides examples of Le Corbusier's Architecture including the Capitol Complex with its High Court, Secretariat and Legislative Assembly, as well as the giant Open Hand Monument. The extravagant Rock Garden features stone sculptures and beautifully 'weird' landscapes.

Shimla

Shimla was once the summer capital of British India and is in the Himalayan foothills. The famous 'Shimla Toy Train' is a narrow-gauge railway which traverses a mountainous route from Kalka to Shimla. The railway was built between 1898-1903 to connect Shimla with the rest of the Indian rail system. In July 2008, UNESCO added the Kalka-Shimla railway to the mountain railways of India World Heritage Site.



Investigate the town of Shimla and visiting the Mall Road and Christs Church, one of the largest Churches in North India and visiting the Himachal State Museum, famous for its ancient coins, paintings and local craftworks. A village-like atmosphere in such a historical cultural environment.



Visit the Jakhoo Temple - the temple has the biggest statue of Hanuman (the bodyguard of Rama). Legend has it that Lord Hanuman stopped here to rest while he was searching for the Sanjivni Booti to revive Lakshmana in the Epic Ramayana. This temple is in honour of the Monkey Lord. Later in the day we will visit the Himalayan bird park, famous for indigenous Himalayan bird life.

Dharamshala

2 nights 30 & 31 March Proceed to Dharamshala, a tiny town on the edge of the Himalayas. Dharamshala is a city in the Indian state of Himachal Pradesh. Surrounded by cedar forests on the edge of the Himalayas, this hillside city is home to the Dalai Lama. The Thekchen Chöling Temple Complex is a spiritual centre for Tibetan Buddhism, while the Library of Tibetan Works and Archives houses thousands of precious manuscripts.



Full day to privately explore the Namgyal Tsemo Monastery, proud home of his holiness Dalai Lama. If you wish, visit the local Tibetan school and village.

Amritsar

2 nights 1 & 2 April 'Superior Room' at <u>Chonor House or similar</u>

Upon arrival in Amritsar, experience the most blissful visit to the Famous Golden Temple and enjoy this sacred time. The Golden Temple is located in the city of Amritsar, Punjab, India. It is one of the most revered spiritual sites of Sikhism. The construction of Harmandir Sahib was intended to build a place of worship for men and women from all walks of life and all religions to worship God equally. Partake in the free community kitchen and meal (Langar) regardless of any distinctions, a tradition that is a hallmark of all Sikh Gurdwaras.

Experience the morning prayer at the Golden Temple, the proceed to JalionWalan Bagan, the very place where the massacre of so many people occurred. The crowd gathered were non-violent Indian nationalists, protesting British conscription of Indians and heavy war tax, and pilgrims celebrating the holiday of Baisakhi. Fifty British soldiers, under the leadership of Brigadier-General Reginald Dyer, opened fire on the gathering; Dyer told his men to shoot to kill and they did. This massacre set the tone for British/Indian relations.



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Early evening, we will head out for a real time experience of visiting the Wagah Border of India and Pakistan. The lowering of the flags ceremony at the Wagah border is a daily military practice that the security forces of India and Pakistan have jointly followed since 1959. The drill is characterized by elaborate and rapid dancelike manoeuvres. It is alternatively a symbol of the two countries' rivalry, as well as brotherhood and cooperation between the two nations.
