Jaipur

After breakfast will proceed to Jaipur also known as the 'Pink City of India' famous for its grand Fort, Palace and colours. Our 5-hour journey will enthral. Historical Jaipur, Rajasthan's capital, is the gateway to India's most flamboyant state. The city's colourful, chaotic streets ebb and flow with a heady brew of old and new. Careering buses dodge dawdling camels, leisurely cycle-rickshaws frustrate swarms of motorbikes, and everywhere buzzing auto rickshaws watch for easy prey. The splendours of Jaipur's majestic past are islands of calm evoking a different pace and another world. At the city's heart, the City Palace continues to house the former royal family; the honeycomb Hawa Mahal gazes on the bazaar below. Patrika Gate is an Architectural splendour awaiting you, and just out of sight, in the arid hill country surrounding the city, is the fairy-tale grandeur of Amber Fort, Jaipur's star attraction. You can embrace the outstanding workmanship done on this beautiful fort visiting the Mirror Palace, courtyards and see the inlay work done on the walls of the Palace. Amber Palace is a MUST SEE!!

Exclusive and discreet, Samode Palace has been host to royalty, celebrities, artists, and the discerning traveller. Awaken to the quiet dawn, or have a cocktail on the terrace garden to the accompaniment of folk musicians. Run your fingers across the intricate story of an ancient mural on an uneven wall. Emerge from a gentle healing massage at the spa, or perhaps just sink into the lavish bed in your room. Samode Palace weaves its magic on you.

A great morning journey leaving Samode Palace at approx. 10AM, travelling to Bikaner and checking into our amazing hotel in the late afternoon. The following day is a day with our guide visiting Junagarh Fort, assorted elaborate havelis of unique Architectural form and the famous Jain Temple. The Junagarh Fort of Bikaner is a magnificent structure around which the city of Bikaner grew up. The fort was built in 1478 by Rao Bika but just existed as a stone fort then. The present grand structure was inaugurated on 17th February 1589. Besides having a rich history, the Junagarh Fort is a feat of Architecture. The Palaces inside the fort, the gardens, balconies, etc. depict a composite Architectural style which is influenced by the cultural differences of the different rulers and foreign inspirations. As time permits, and if there is interest from the group, a visit to Karni Mata Temple which is also known as the 'Temple of Rats' can be included.

Once again time for cocktails and great food and enjoy every sumptuous moment at our great home, the Narendra Bhawan Hotel.




A hearty breakfast in Bikaner then enjoy a 5 hour scenic drive to Jaisalmer where we will check into our perfect home with views from the rooftop. Jaisalmer is also called the 'Golden City of India' as it is famous for its grand forts and amazing sand dunes. Jaisalmer is a former medieval trading in Rajasthan, in the Thar Desert. It's distinguished by its yellow sandstone Architecture. Jaisalmer Fort is a sprawling hilltop citadel buttressed by 99 bastions. Behind its massive walls stand the Maharaja's Palace and intricately carved Jain temples. Take it easy in the afternoon and the narrow laneways or relax on the roof deck and look at the life below.

Next morning after breakfast visit Jaisalmer Fort, a World Heritage Site declared by UNESCO. The fort was built by the Rajput ruler Rawal Jaisal in 1156 AD. Jaisalmer fort stands amidst the sandy expanse of Trikuta Hill and has been the scene of many battles. Its massive yellow sandstone walls are a tawny lion colour during the day, fading to honey-gold as the sun sets, thereby camouflaging the fort in the yellow desert. For this reason, it is also known as the Sonar Quila or Golden Fort. Jaisalmer Fort rises to a height of 76 metres and 4.6 metre tall walls forming a double line of defence.

(A night in Desert Camp)

1 night

A late breakfast at our hotel. At approx. lunchtime we will proceed to the Kafila Desert Camp. Located approximately 30 kilometres outside Jaisalmer on the way to the sand dunes, Kafila is enhanced by the beauty of the Thar Desert. Your overnight stay includes a jeep ride over rough (and fun) terrain into the desert, and also includes a camel trek through the sand dunes to watch the sunset should you desire. In the evening enjoy some local folk music and dance by the dunes. Enjoy a soothing spa at the resort, dinner and breakfast also. Your tents are hardly 'basic', with A/C, your accommodation is complete with plumbing and (again) even more luxury than you could be used to.

Jodhpur

2 nights

A beautiful drive to scenic Jodhpur, the 'Blue' city. Upon arrival, check into hotel and spend the later afternoon relaxing by the pool, shopping, or whatever your taste desires. Tomorrow we will visit the famous 15th-century Mehrangarh Fort, a former palace set on a rocky outcrop. The fort overlooks the walled city, where many buildings are painted the city's iconic shade of blue. An optional visit could be the Umaid Bhawan Palace, a building of unparalleled Architectural magnificence, now a famous Luxury Hotel in Jodhpur, as you and your enthusiasm permits!

After breakfast a journey by A/C mini bus to Udaipur, arriving early afternoon. Nestled on the shimmering Lake Pichola, with the ochre and purple ridges of the wooded Aravalli Hills stretching in every direction, Udaipur has a romance of setting unmatched in Rajasthan. Fantastical Palaces, temples, havelis and countless narrow, crooked, timeless streets add the human counterpoint to the citys' natural charms. For the visitor there's the tranquillity of a boat ride on the lake (which we will be doing, including a stop at Jag Mandir in the middle of the lake), the bustle of ancient bazaars with endless tempting shops. To this day, Udaipur still enjoys the tag of 'the most romantic spot on the continent of India' (with slight bias from Udaipurians!)



Celebrate the spectacular Diwali (Festival of Lights) with us from our amazing rooftop, 24 Oct.












1x Free Lake Pichola cruise
