

Diwali is a five-day event, culminating in the evening of one special day (12th November) celebrated by millions of Hindus, Sikhs and Jains across the world. The festival, which coincides with the Hindu New Year, celebrates new beginnings and the triumph of good over evil and light over darkness. While each faith has its own reason to celebrate the festival, one of the most popular stories told is the legend of Lord Rama and his wife Sita returning to their kingdom in northern India from exile after defeating the demon king Ravanna in the 15th century BC. Houses are decorated in excess with colourful lights, and firework displays are held while families feast and share gifts. Diwali celebrates the union of religions and the joy of sharing abounds

### <u>Program</u>

Delhi

3 nights 9, 10 & 11 Oct On arrival into Delhi in the early evening you will be met at the airport and transferred to your glamorous 5-star hotel. Have a good night's sleep, you deserve it, and wake up refreshed and 'ready to go'.

Old Delhi and Jama Masjid - Relax and take it easy, as you might still be jet lagged. After a late breakfast, proceed to the old part of Delhi for a rickshaw ride through the back alleys of Old Delhi, the silver streets, vegetable and spice markets and visit the famous Jama Masjid, one of the oldest mosques in Delhi.




*Humayun's Tomb* – now a UNESCO World Heritage Site, built in the 16<sup>th</sup>-C by Haji Begum, wife of Humayun the second Mughal emperor, Humayun's Tomb is an example of Mughal Architecture in Delhi.

**Qutub Minar** - this 72.5 m high Victory Pillar is a victory stand of a Muslim King Kutub-ud-din- Aibak in India. In 1199 Kutub-ud-Din started its construction and it was completed in 1236 by Iltutmish, the son-in-law of Kutub.

India Gate – National monument of India. India gate is in the administrative locations of the country. Constructed in memory of 90,000 soldiers of British-Indian army who fought in the Second World War, the structure was built under the leadership of Sir Edwin Lutyens. The architectural complex is made of red stone and granite and is the finest example of Indo-British architectural monument.

And let's go along Rajpath, past the imposing India Gate, Parliament House, the President's Residence and would end with a drive through the Diplomatic Enclave.

After breakfast we will drive from Delhi in our comfortable A/C mini bus to Mandawa. On arrival in Mandawa check into our amazing hotel. Stop for lunch at a traditional dhaba and afterwards, complete our journey arriving early to mid afternoon. You should take some time to relax at the hotel, and in the afternoon or early evening take a walk through the village. Mandawa is famous for its colourful houses and havelis, palaces and paintings. The structures remind us of the cultural and social hotspot this place used to be in a bygone era. The town has a population of 21,000 and was settled and fortified in the 18<sup>th</sup>-C by dominant merchant families. The wealthy businessmen of the village constructed many havelis and baolis with coloured paintings adorning their walls. Today these are some of the major attractions for tourists visiting Rajasthan.

And now it's time to explore the beautiful town of Mandawa and surrounding areas, to see a big variety of havelis including Murmuria Haveli, Chockhani Haveli, Hanuman Prasad Goenka Haveli among others. The Mandawa Fort is one of the most famous forts in Mandawa and is adorned with paintings of Lord Krishna. The Mandawa Fort is an attraction as it helps reveal a lot about the rich history while revealing the unique features of Rajasthani architecture. As you desire, make time for the main bazaar, it's an interesting walk through the town.

Bikaner

2 nights 14 & 15 Oct A great morning journey by A/C mini bus to Bikaner and checking into our amazing hotel. Once you have relaxed for some time, let's do an afternoon city tour. The **Junagarh Fort** of Bikaner is a magnificent structure around which the city of Bikaner grew up. The fort was built in 1478 by Rao Bika but just existed as a stone fort then. The present grand structure was inaugurated on 17th February 1589. Besides having a rich history, the Junagarh Fort is a feat of Architecture. The Palaces inside the fort, the gardens, balconies, etc. depict a composite Architectural style which is influenced by the cultural differences of the different rulers and foreign inspirations.

Today, another must visit is to *Karni Mata Temple* which is also known as the Temple of Rats (not for the faint hearted). Once again time for cocktails and great food and enjoy every sumptuous moment at our great home, the Narendra Bhawan Hotel.

Jaisalmer

2 nights 16 & 17 Oct A drive to **Jaisalmer** where we will check into our perfect home with views from the rooftop, all over Jaisalmer. **Jaisalmer** is also called the 'Golden City of India' as it is famous for its grand forts and amazing sand dunes. Jaisalmer is a former medieval trading centre and a princely state in Rajasthan, in the heart of the Thar Desert. It's distinguished by its yellow sandstone Architecture. Dominating the skyline is Jaisalmer Fort, a sprawling hilltop citadel buttressed by 99 bastions which sits on our hotel doorstep. Behind its massive walls stand the ornate Maharaja's Palace and intricately carved Jain temples. Let's take it easy in the afternoon and either walk the narrow laneways or relax on the roof deck and look at the life below in Jaisalmer.

Morning after breakfast will proceed for the tour of Jaisalmer town visit **Jaisalmer Fort**. Jaisalmer Fort is a World Heritage Site declared by UNESCO. The fort was built by the Rajput ruler Rawal Jaisal in 1156 AD. Jaisalmer fort stands amidst the sandy expanse of Trikuta Hill and has been the scene of many battles. Its massive yellow sandstone walls are a tawny lion colour during the day, fading to honeygold as the sun sets, thereby camouflaging the fort in the yellow desert. For this reason, it is also known as the Sonar Quila or Golden Fort. Jaisalmer fort rises to a height of 76 metres and 4.6 metre tall wall forming a double line of defence.



A drive to scenic *Jodhpur*, stopping (if you wish) for a camel ride in the desert en route. Afternoon tour of the amazing City of Jodhpur. Jodhpur is called the blue city of Rajasthan famous for its grand Jodhpur fort and blue pottery work, not to mention so many buildings being painted in blue also!

Today we will visit the famous (and huge) Meharangarh Fort. The 15th-century Mehrangarh Fort is a former palace, now a museum, displaying weapons, paintings and elaborate royal palanquins. Set on a rocky outcrop, the fort overlooks the walled city, where many buildings are painted the city's iconic shade of blue. An additional 'must visit' is the Umaid Bhawan Palace, a building of Architectural magnificence, now a famous Luxury Hotel. Dependant on time, you may elect to visit the local market or merely return to our hotel to relax.

Udaipur

2 nights 20 & 21 Oct A journey by A/C mini bus brings us to **Udaipur**. Beside shimmering Lake Pichola, with the ochre and purple ridges of the wooded Aravalli Hills stretching away in every direction, Udaipur has a romance of setting unmatched in Rajasthan and arguably in all India. Fantastical Palaces, temples, havelis and countless narrow, crooked, timeless streets add the human counterpoint to the city's natural charms. For the visitor there's the tranquillity of boat rides on the lake, the bustle and colour of ancient bazaars, a wonderful and lively arts scene, the quaint old-world feel of its better hotels, endless tempting shops and some lovely countryside to explore on wheels or on foot. Udaipur still enjoys the tag of 'the most romantic spot on the continent of India' (with slight bias from Udaipurians!). Your afternoon is free.

Day tour of city and of lakes, and visiting the famous *Udaipur City Palace.* The Palace is an example of the splendour that the rulers of Mewar enjoyed centuries ago, and it still appears to be just as majestic. It is located on the eastern banks of Pichola lake. The palace is a fusion of Rajasthani, European, Chinese and Mughal Architecture, making it one of the most alluring historical attractions of Udaipur. The Palace complex houses monuments like the Monsoon Palace, Lake Palace, Jagdish Temple, Jag Mandir, and Neemach Mata temple, and it is surrounded by the Aravalli Mountains, giving it a gorgeous background. Built completely with marble and granite, it also has the beautiful appeal of marble-work, mirror-work, silver-work, inlay-work, wall paintings and murals. This was originally a Palace of the Maharaja of Udaipur. A ride by boat on Lake Pichola (optional) is enjoyable and you can see where the famous James Bond movie 'Octypussy' was filmed in the middle of the lake, now a luxury hotel. Afterwards a wander through the market streets by will be wonderful.

2 nights 22 & 23 Oct After breakfast will proceed (6.5 hour journey, sorry) to the 'Pink City of India' famous for its grand Fort, Palace and colours. Rajasthan's capital is the gateway to India's most flamboyant state. The city's colourful, chaotic streets ebb and flow with a heady brew of old and new. In the midst of this mayhem, the splendours of Jaipur's majestic past are islands of relative calm evoking a different pace and another world. At the city's heart, the City Palace continues to house the former royal family; the Jantar Mantar, the royal observatory, maintains a heavenly aspect; and the honeycomb Hawa Mahal gazes on the wonderful bazaar below

After breakfast we will go to the grand and famous Amer Fort. This magnificent fort comprises an extensive Palace complex, built from sandstone, and white marble, and is divided into four main sections, each with its own courtyard. You can walk up to the fort from the road in about 15 minutes or take a 4WD or motorbike to the top and back. You can embrace the outstanding workmanship done on this beautiful fort visiting the Mirror Palace, courtyards and see the inlay work done on the walls of the Palace. Later we will be visiting the City Palace, this is the Palace of the Maharaja of Jaipur and part of the Palace is converted into a very interesting museum. A stop for the most famous 'Lassi' in India is a great thing to do too. In the evening, we MUST go to Bar Palladio, right on the property!

You will also visit the stunning TAJ MAHAL, an ivory-white marble mausoleum on the river Yamuna, commissioned in 1631 by Mughal Emperor Shah Jahan to house his favourite wife, Mumtaz Mahal.
